

Orfa was Adolphe Adam's penultimate ballet, with an intriguing scenario based on Nordic mythology. It shares analogies with Hesiod's *Theogony* and Wagner's *Ring* cycle in depicting the struggle between the older gods (Loki) and younger gods (Odin). Full of archetypal Romantic elements, *Orfa* was mounted with the lavish stage spectacle for which the Paris Opéra was famous, and featured Fanny Cerrito in the title role. Adam's writing shows increasingly vivid orchestral imagination, drama and tonal colour, with roles for several instrumental soloists. This world premiere recording uses a new edition copied from Adam's original manuscript score held at the Bibliothèque nationale de France.

Key Features:

- Dario Salvi has a strong presence on Naxos and has recorded an album of Humperdinck's music for the stage on 8.574177, music by Bronsart on 8.660476, four volumes of Auber overtures on 8.574005, 8.574006, 8.574007 and 8.574143, Johann Strauss II on 8.660434-35 as well as Suppé and Marschner. Adam's penultimate ballet "Orfa" was at the forefront of my mind for some time. I had heard about it and listened to some piano selection and I was completely intrigued by it.

Jean-Guillaume Bart, Dr. Robert Letellier and I spend a considerable amount of time researching the material and the story behind this ballet and this project would have not happened without their exhaustive competence and huge input.

Adam, but interestingly the musical numbers here are much longer than in other ballets he composed and this makes for a more homogeneous and organic listening experience. The character of the music describes and underlines the action on stage beautifully. I hope to raise interest in choreographers and theatre into staging this forgotten, but very important, ballet.

Dario Salvi is a Scottish-Italian conductor, musicologist and researcher who specialises in the restoration and performance of rare works. Salvi conducts symphonic works, ballet, opera and operettas across Europe, the Middle East and the United States. His passion is the rediscovery and performance of long-forgotten masterpieces. Recent collaborations with Naxos include a series on Auber's overtures and orchestral music alongside numerous other projects, such as the operettas of Johann Strauss II, Franz von Suppé and Joseph Bayer, and world premiere recordings of works by Giacomo Meyerbeer, Heinrich Marschner and Engelbert Humperdinck. Salvi has also written books on Viennese operetta, published new musical editions of operas and is a lifetime honorary member of The Johann Strauss Society of Great Britain.

About the Sofia Philharmonic Orchestra



The Sofia Philharmonic Orchestra has long established itself as one of the leading institutions in Bulgaria's musical life, representative of the overall contemporary musical culture of the country, and has garnered substantial recognition all over the world. The orchestra's high artistic achievement is associated with prominent figures such as Sasha Popov, Konstantin Iliev, Vassil Kazandjiev, Emil Tabakov, Julian Kovatchev and Nayden Todorov.
